### **Prayerwalking**

A group of people from Alabama went to village K in Africa to prayerwalk. Do you know what prayerwalking is? Well, it's walking and praying. There's a fancy definition that says "prayerwalking is praying on site with insight." Okay, what does THAT mean? Well, it's walking and praying. Really! Christians go to a place like village K and walk through the streets. When they see a house, they pray for the family that lives in the house. If they see a school, they pray for the children who are studying. At the town hall, they pray for the government. The Christian volunteers walk and pray—that's prayerwalking. They are praying for missionaries or other Christians to be able to tell the stories of Jesus in the village or town and praying that the people will become Christians too.

The group of people from Alabama walked and prayed. When they left, missionaries went back to village K and drilled a well. They also used a "Good News" flipchart and tape to tell about 100 villagers about Jesus. The missionaries told stories from 40 pictures for four long days.

After four days, the leaders of the village told the missionaries to stop drilling and to move on to another village. They had told many stories of Jesus but the people in village K did not become Christians. Pray for the Kanuri people in village K. Pray that they won't be able to forget the stories and that they will one day become Christians.
